#### **Communication and Language**

This term, we are developing our confidence in speaking and listening, building the skills we need to express ourselves clearly and understand others. Through conversations, stories, and discussions, we are learning to communicate thoughtfully and with purpose. We are learning to:

- Listen attentively and respond with relevant questions, comments, and actions.
- Make thoughtful observations about what we hear and ask questions to clarify our understanding.
- Engage in meaningful back-and-forth conversations with friends and adults.
- Show focused attention during teaching, respond appropriately even when engaged in tasks, and follow instructions involving multiple steps.
- Participate in small group, class, and one-to-one discussions, sharing our ideas using recently introduced vocabulary.

## **Physical Development**

We are becoming increasingly confident in how we move and use our bodies. From energetic games to careful control of tools, we are learning how to stay safe, strong, and ready for writing. We are learning to:

- Explore different ways of moving, adjusting our movements to stay safe and reduce risk.
- Jump off objects and land with control, using our hands, arms, and bodies to stabilise and balance.
- Negotiate space successfully during racing and chasing games, adjusting speed or direction to avoid obstacles.
- Travel under, over, around, and through climbing and balancing equipment with increasing skill.
- Hold a pencil effectively using a tripod grip in preparation for fluent writing.

#### **Understanding the World**

We are developing a deeper understanding of the world around usits history, cultures, environments, and living things—through handson exploration and storytelling.

#### We are learning to:

- Step into the past through stories, understanding how life has changed over time.
- Recognise similarities and differences between religious and cultural communities in the UK.
- Observe and talk about patterns and changes in our environment.
- Explore and compare different types of environments.
- Observe animals and plants up close in our bee and butterfly garden.
- Understand how and why changes happen in nature, and how to care for living things.

#### Literacu

Stories are at the heart of our learning. We are developing our love of reading, building early writing skills, and becoming confident communicators.

## We are learning to:

- Use vocabulary and forms of speech influenced by the stories we hear.
- Describe story settings, characters, and events in increasing detail.
- Create our own stories through drawing, storytelling, and writing.
- Continue rhyming strings, identify alliteration, and clap out syllables in words.
- Read sentences aloud using phonics and recognise some common exception words by sight.
- Form recognisable letters and write simple phrases and sentences others can read.
