MATHS CHALLENGE

Last Friday, our team of three Year 5 boys, (Blake, Noah and Ewan) had a very successful day at the 'World Mathematics Championships' at St Oscar's. They truly did us proud.

There were three challenges. Firstly, a logic/problem solving 'duel' involving matchsticks. Next, was an innovation challenge where they had to make a bridge between two tables using very basic and limited materials (spaghetti, paper etc). Their bridge was then tested. The one that could hold the maximum number of weights would win. Finally, there was the 'lightening' challenge where they had to answer a maths question correctly with a runner safely delivering it into the judges' hands before the next question was given. Some of the questions were staggeringly hard - Mrs Sheikh was really impressed with their resilience to keep going!

They came 1st out of 27 teams for the innovation challenge. They named their invention 'Baptist Bridge'! Before theirs was tested, the winning bridge had managed to hold 16 weights... Baptist Bridge, however managed an incredible 29! The boys received a medal and a prize at the end and absolutely loved their day.



SCIENCE VISIT

On Monday, the Observatory at Herstmonceux brought their big dome to show the children. The children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 took turns going into the dome and going on a journey in space. They had great fun discovering stars and planets and learnt many new facts. They then followed this up in class afterwards. Thank you to all the parents for supporting the visit, the children thoroughly enjoyed it and it really enhanced their learning.
