REMINDER - WORLD BOOK DAY

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 7th March 2024 and as a school, we are planning a variety of exciting activities to promote and encourage children to see themselves as a reader.

We are asking the children to come into school dressed as their favourite book character, sharing the books that they enjoy reading or having read to them.

We will also be doing a 'Teacher Read', where members of staff will be reading their favourite books and children can choose which classroom they wish to visit and which books they wish to hear. Individual key stages will be planning their own activities for the day but all will involve the children seeing themselves as readers and enjoying books. World Book Day will be a fun-filled and productive day for the children celebrating the pleasure that is found in reading and promoting reading for all!

SEND SPOTLIGHT FROM MRS STONER

Supporting our children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) is a vital part of any school's ethos and curriculum, and at St John's it is an integral element in the structure of our school and the planning of the curriculum. To ensure that all children are treated equitably and having every opportunity to succeed, there is a great deal of work that goes on 'behind the scenes', with many agencies, staff members, parents and children working together.

As the SENDCo, it is my job to pull together these many factors, and this can sometimes seem to be a frustratingly slow moving process, as many agencies that we work with are short-staffed and under-resourced. Luckily, with a wealth of experience from our hardworking staff, we make every effort to offer those who need it, the support that they need.

We are going to include a SEND Spotlight feature in the newsletter each term explaining the many components that contribute to all children at St John the Baptist being provided with equal access to a broad and balanced curriculum.

These include:

- formative and summative assessments;
- observations;
- parental, staff, agency and Local SENDCo meetings;
- discussing and writing Cause for Concerns;
- writing, implementing and reviewing Individual Support Plans (ISPs) previously Individual Learning Plans (ILPs);
- referring to agencies and completing the paperwork and additional assessments required for these;
- arranging and implementing staff training;
- compiling and writing Educational, Health Care Plan Applications (ECHNA);
- arranging and attending Annual Reviews for children with Educational Health Care Plans.

Each term, I will explain and expand on each of these areas, as well as sharing relevant information related to SEND, including support for parents of children with SEND. I am on the door most Thursdays, if you have a quick question or if you would like to arrange a meeting. Alternatively, you can contact me through the class teacher or the office.
